CESifo is inviting its research network members to submit papers to the 2021 CESifo Area Conference on the Economics of Education. Organized by **Eric A. Hanushek** (Stanford University, Area Director) and **Ludger Woessmann** (ifo Institute), the conference brings together network members to discuss their recent research and to encourage broader interactions, particularly on both sides of the Atlantic. Submitted papers may deal with any topic within the broad domain of the Economics of Education. Accepted papers will appear in the CESifo Working Paper Series.

Please note that the same paper can only be submitted to one of the CESifo Area Conferences. Papers which are more related to the topic of other Area Conferences may be re-directed to the respective Area Director.

The **Distinguished CESifo Affiliate Award**, aimed at encouraging talented young scholars, will be awarded to the best paper presented by a young author at the conference. A maximum of three award candidates will be invited to attend and present their paper. Candidates must be no more than five years after completing their PhD (same applies to any co-authors). The winning paper will appear in the CESifo Working Paper Series and the prize winner will receive a €3000 prize. All CESifo Research Fellows are welcome to nominate candidates by submitting the nominee's paper to Eric Hanushek ([hanushek@stanford.edu](mailto:hanushek@stanford.edu)), along with a c.v. and a letter explaining the motivation for the nomination. The deadline for nominations is **15 June 2021**.
